Numerous crudely insulting anonymous letters, full of profanities, are sent to the residents of an English seaside town, and foul-mouthed rowdy Irish migrant Rose is charged with the crime. However, when the town’s women investigate, they suspect that something is amiss... Please be aware – this film is VERY swear-y (but that’s the whole point) - it’s also very funny.

As the story unfolds through the eyes of the mother, teacher and both children, shocking truths begin to emerge, showing the story from different viewpoints - the teacher, the principal and the two children.
