News from the Parish Council

It is great to see that many people are keeping their roadside **hedges** trimmed. Please could people with **gravel and stone driveways** remember to sweep the loose chippings off the road so that pedestrians, including families and people using mobility aids, can pass safely. The leaking water opposite the Recreation Ground has been reported to Anglian Water and works to carry out repairs have been programmed.

Correspondence from the War Memorials Trust states that the grant does not cover the cost of adding names to the **War Memorial** if those men are already named on another memorial. The Trust has provided information that all three of the proposed additions are on other memorials: THORPE Frederick John (WW1) is on the Rolls of Honour in Swaffham and Worcester Cathedral, and also on the War Memorials in Great Witley and Downham Market. Girling Frederick Stephen (WW2) and Margetson (Elijah) Reginald are both on the War Memorial in Foulsham. In the light of this information the Parish Council has decided not to add the names to the Hindolveston War Memorial. As the Memorial is a scheduled monument, the shaft and cross are not to be cleaned. However, the Parish Council is arranging for the plinth to be cleaned and the lettering repainted to improve legibility. Half of the cost will be covered by the grant from the War Memorials Trust.

The Parish Council is expecting a delivery of 105 'year round colour' saplings from the Woodland Trust at the beginning of November for planting in the **Nature Reserve** in January. The Parish Councillors are going to have an onsite meeting with interested parties (date to be arranged in December) to plan the way forward taking into consider the management suggestions from Norfolk Wildlife Trust and others. Do get in touch if you would like to be part of this group and /or would like to help plant saplings

The Parish Council is hoping to take up an offer from *Finding Fitness* to apply for lottery funding to improve the **playground equipment** by installing a traverse climbing wall (see photo). The climbing wall is suitable for everyone from four years upwards (including adults).
