Please remember to clear up after your dog

Over the last few months, the problems with dog fouling in the village have been increasing. It is probably only a few careless dog walkers, but the Parish Council has received a number of complaints. The District Council, as the enforcing authority, has been informed and site visits have been arranged.

Dog mess is not only unpleasant if stepped on, but it is also potentially harmful. It may contain a parasitic worm called Toxocara, which can lead to a serious illness in humans called toxocariasis, causing visual impairment and possible blindness. It is thought that young children are at a higher risk of developing Toxocariasis, as they are more likely to come into contact with soil or sand that contains dog mess. So please ensure that all mess is cleared away from the pavements and verges, and from the playing field.

It is an offence not to clean up after your dog in any public area (including roads, verges and private land open to the public) in North Norfolk. Failure to do so will incur an £80 fixed penalty fine (max £1,000).
