HINDOLVESTON VILLAGE SCREEN

Report for the Annual Parish Meeting 17 April 2025

Hindolveston Village Screen has been operating since 2005 (yes, nearly twenty years – surprises us every time) and over that time has shown 167 films.

We run two seasons of films – the Autumn Season from September to December, and the Spring Season from January to April, then close for the summer months.

Each season has 4 films on the third Saturday of the month, and since 2014 we have added 2 foreign language films in the intervening weeks (a whole world of international cinema to discover).

Creative Arts East

Village Cinema was initiated by the arts and community charity organisation Creative Arts East in order to bring cinema to rural locations in villages in East Anglia.

Creative Arts East Screen is a community cinema network made up of volunteer promoting groups in rural Norfolk and parts of Suffolk and Cambridgeshire, who screen anything from the latest blockbusters and timeless classics, to live-recorded theatre performances, foreign language films and contemporary independent titles.

These screenings take place in non-urban areas which don't usually have conventional cinemas on their doorstep, helping communities come together to experience the magic of cinema in their local village hall or community venue.

We started out borrowing Creative Arts East's equipment, but managed to purchase our own projector, amplification and electric screen, which are now permanently established in the Hall.

Each film requires a licence from the distributor to show it to the public (which costs around £100 per screening) although we also get licensing subsidies from Creative Arts East which reduces costs. We keep ticket prices to a reasonable £5.00, and all the profits go directly for the upkeep and running of the Village Hall.

Over those twenty years, we have raised over £13,000 for the Village Hall, and have shown films to a total audience of over 6,800 villagers.

The cinema opens its doors at 7.00pm for a 7.30pm start on Saturdays.

Come along early, and take the opportunity to have a drink or just have a chat with your neighbours. We love it when there's a community buzz around the Hall.

The chairs (donated by the BFI) are pretty comfortable, and at each screening we sell the sumptuous local producer Dann's Ice Cream. And the Village Hall Bar is open for Saturday evening for the sale of beer, wine, spirits or coffee.

Get Involved: The films

The choice of films is decided by a committee of 5 people – but we are always open to suggestions, especially foreign language films.

We try to show interesting films, rather than the blockbusters on show at Cromer or Fakenham, and hopefully choose films that people may have heard about but missed, or introduce them to new cinema.
