The Parish Council was fortunate to have the support of Finding Fitness who assisted with the application for lottery funding to cover the cost of this new piece of equipment. At the recent meeting, it was agreed to make the following donations: £30 to East Anglian Air Ambulance; £20 each to Break; Tapping House Hospice; and EACH (children's hospice) £10 to SANDS. A donation of approximately £20 was approved to purchase a poppy wreath for laying at the War Memorial for Remembrance Sunday.
