Based on a true story, 'A Big Hit' is a warm French drama about an actor working with a bunch of hard-boiled prisoners to produce a theatrical Beckett play. Etienne, an endearing but unemployed actor, runs a theatre workshop in a prison, where he collects an unlikely troupe of prisoners to stage Beckett's play 'Waiting for Godot'. When he is allowed to take the convicts on a successful tour outside of prison and a unique relationship grows between these ad hoc actors and their director. But soon comes the final performance in Paris. Will their last night together be the biggest hit of them all?
